

## DRAFT MINUTES

### Minutes of Warleggan Parish Meeting of 12<sup>th</sup> March 2013 at the Jubilee Hall, Mount

*Important note: the following is the draft minutes for the above meeting, and may contain errors or omissions. If you wish to advise of any such errors or omissions, make your observations at the next parish meeting, when the minutes will be read out.*

**Present / Apologies** - see Parish Clerk's copy of the minutes for list of those (12 people) recorded as attending, and of the (2) apologies received.

The [minutes of 19<sup>th</sup> February](#) were read and agreed as a true record.

#### Matters Arising

1. Mrs Watson explained that candidates for local council elections will be announced on 9<sup>th</sup> April giving only a short time for their invitation to the AGM on 16<sup>th</sup> April.
2. Mr Chris W. has produced an email address for Warleggan Parish Meeting (see Clerk's copy for the address); however, concern was expressed at us being flooded with items if we publicise this and we may lose out on hard copies of plans etc. The general opinion was to keep its use to a minimum.

#### Other Business

1. Mr & Mrs W. had purchased new Christmas decorations for the village Christmas tree. It was agreed to reimburse them for the £13.20 which these cost (proposed JK, seconded VC)
2. Planning Application for Pixie Nook, Warleggan [PA13/00583](#) "Repairs to and re-instatement of roof, gable-end and chimney" of a listed building. There was unanimous support for this; however, we felt that the reinstalled slate should be 'sized' slate, which is in keeping with the property, and not Rag Slate.
3. Mr Andrew L. spoke of the poor state of the ponies on Warleggan Downs. One was found to have septicaemia and worms, but recovered after veterinary intervention; but a further one was found dead, and two more fresh skeletons were found, and one had to be put down. Many others were in a poor condition. This issue is to be raised at PACT meetings but in urgent situations we should phone Animal Welfare<sup>1</sup> or Julie Downton from Cornwall Council. It was noted that Cornwall Council had acted quickly when concern was raised.
4. Mr John K. once again spoke of the poor state of cattle and problems caused by cattle on Glebe land at Warleggan. There was concern that there was lack of feeding during winter and lack of access to water. The land is often a 'sea of mud' and they are again wandering through the village causing damage. Mr K. has agreed to draft a letter for the Clerk to forward onto relevant persons.
