

COMMUNITY 'DIGITAL STORYTELLING' EVENT

What are your memories of drought and water scarcity in the Fowey area?

You are warmly invited to a community **digital storytelling event** to **share memories, experience and local knowledge** about past drought and water-use by the River Fowey, and learn about the science of drought.

Digital stories are short audio recordings with accompanying images selected by the person whose story it is. The stories will form a local archive of resources on drought, water scarcity and water use that can aid understanding and decision-making.

The workshop will take place at **Lostwithiel Community Centre** on **Saturday 6th June 2015, 11am-3.30pm.**

A sandwich lunch, teas and coffees will be provided.

Programme

- ❖ Introduce ourselves and share a memory about drought, the River Fowey or a local water event
- ❖ Hear about how we will predict future water scenarios in the River Fowey catchment
- ❖ Learn about how to make a digital story
- ❖ Take part in a group activity to begin to plan your digital story (no technical expertise is needed)
