

DRAFT MINUTES

Minutes of Warleggan Parish Meeting of Friday 26 May 2017, at the Jubilee Hall, Mount

Important: the following is a transcription of the handwritten draft minutes for the meeting, and may contain errors or omissions. The surnames of the people mentioned in the minutes are not given in this transcript (check Parish Clerk's copy for full details). If you wish to advise of any errors or omissions, make your observations at the next parish meeting, when the minutes will be read out.

Present / Apologies - see Parish Clerk's copy of the minutes for list of those (12 people) recorded as attending, and of the (1) apologies received.

The minutes of the Parish Meeting of 30 March were read and agreed as a true record.

Matters Arising

1. Amendment to Code of Conduct for Officers and Sub-Committee members which was agreed at the AGM was read by Mr John K.
2. Periphery of land near Colliford Tavern which banked with used tyres. Mr John K will refer this to our new country councillor Mr Martin Eddy.
3. The unoccupied council house at Warleggan is to be sold off by the County Council.
4. Letter from SW Water regarding the sewage capacity of the sewage works in Mount was read by Mr Andy M. They say that the current system is adequate and would cope with the application for five dwellings and a shop, but would not accept run off from this development.

Other business

1. Plaque for trees in the churchyard car park in memory of the men in the parish who died in the first world war: Mr John K has a quote from ParcSigns. The preferred option will cost £169.50 + VAT. All were in agreement to proceed with this option as outlined.
2. Concern had been expressed about a vehicle being parked regularly outside the reading room, which was obscuring the view from the seat as well as restricting visibility on the crossroads.
3. Planning application planning application [PA17/04463](#) for Building North of Wainsford House Two Waters Foot for non-material amendment for the insertion of two additional dormer windows in the south facing roof plane in respect of decision notice PA14/08793: Mrs E felt that this amendment would enhance its appearance and Mr John K commented that this change would make it look more domestic compared to its industrial past. The Planning Sub-Committee voted 5-1 in favour of the amendment (five in favour, one opposed, one abstained)
4. Mr John K observed how helpful Mr Chris W has been in transferring information to the parish website on to him.
5. Children on bicycles in Mount: Whilst all present appreciated the benefits of using bicycles, concern had been expressed for the safety of the children from traffic. It was agreed to put a letter in the parish magazine, and Mr John K will speak to staff at Cardinham and St Neot schools to promote good road sense.
