TAWNY OWLS CALLING



Do you have owls calling near you? Some areas of the parish have them but the higher moorland areas probably don't. The British Trust for Ornithology [BTO] are organizing a nationwide survey to discover the state of the tawny owl population – are they declining, holding their own or increasing?

Phase 2 of Project Owl started on 30th Sept, the Tawny Owl Calling Survey. This involves a 20 minute survey from your garden or any other public area or space such as local Churchyard for example. This survey provides one of the best opportunities for many years to build a picture of Tawny Owl in our county.

The survey is however, not only interested in where Owls are, we want to know where they aren't so even if you have never heard owls from your garden or local area this is no excuse not to join up. The survey is looking for 'zeroheroes' just as much as positive records. The survey runs until March 30th, it's 20 minutes, once a week. You do not need to count every week but the more counts you do the better quality the Citizen Science is.

The link to the Calling Survey page is below where you will find a PDF containing full survey instructions and at the bottom of the page there is an audio containing the sounds of male and female Tawny Owl. This is one survey you can do without being an expert at bird identification and you don't have to be a BTO member.

CLIMATE VISION

ST.NEOT CHURCH 11.00am - SUNDAY NOVEMBER 18th

A few handy facts :-

- There are 560 million cars in the World currently running on fossil fuel.
- If everyone in the world lived like the average European we would need 3 planets to live on. If everyone lived like the average American we would need 5 planets
- Human activity puts 100 times as much CO2 into the atmosphere per annum than volcanic activity.
- The climate is always changing but it has never changed with this speed and intensity in any interglacial period ever in geological history (10 times the rate in fact).

LAND TO THE SOUTH OF NOEL'S MEADOW

You may recall that in August 2017 a planning application for the construction of 5 dwellings and 1 flat over a shop was refused. The applicant appealed against this refusal and following an inspection and consideration of representations (including those from Warleggan Parish Meeting) the Planning Inspector issued a decision on 26 October. The appeal was dismissed with the following conclusion by the Inspector.

"I have found that the residential development of the site would comply with the settlement policies of the Local Plan and the Framework, and would not harm the character and appearance of the area. However, it has not been adequately demonstrated that an affordable housing contribution cannot be provided and as such the proposal conflicts with LP Policy 8 and the Development Plan considered as a whole. There are no material considerations that outweigh this conflict." The full decision may be found on the Cornwall Council planning web-site under reference PA17/05972.

The subject of Colliford Corner has been raised at your Parish Meetings. On your behalf I attended the planning appeal hearing where the case for Colliford Corner was placed before a Planning Inspector. The Inspector looked at all the evidence put forward from both sides, listened to arguments about the resident's status as a gypsy from a planning policy perspective and the length of time he had spent on the site. Following the submissions the Inspector went to Coliford to look first hand at the site. Seven days later the Inspector issued his report stating *"The development causes considerable harm to the AONB and the harm caused is not outweighed by the appellant's personal circumstances. I shall uphold the enforcement notice and refuse to grant planning permission on the deemed application"*

The appellant now has 6 month to comply with the enforcement notice by ceasing to use the land for residential purposes, remove the residential caravan, demolish and remove the wooden chalet, remove services and all debris resulting from residential use, and restore the land to its former condition.

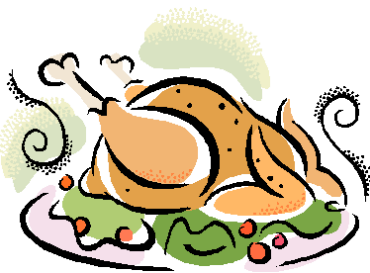

MERLIN MS CENTRE

Cornish Charity joins forces with recycling network to help people dispose of their old cars. If your car is nearing the end of its life and you're not sure what to do with it, you can now donate it to a local charity.

The Merlin MS Centre, based at Hewas Water near St Austell, has partnered up with Charity Car, a scheme set up by Car Take Back, the UK's largest car recycling network. The scheme enables people to give to charity in a different way – raise money for charity and get rid of your old car at the same time. Getting rid of your old car can seem like a daunting prospect but with Charity car the process is simple. You can donate scrap or used cars to the scheme; if your car is ready to be scrapped it will be recycled and if your car is used it will be auctioned, either way the money will be donated to your chosen charity. 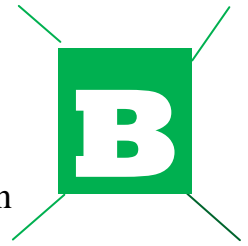
