

DRAFT MINUTES

Minutes of Warleggan Parish Meeting 27th June 2019, at the Jubilee Hall, Mount

Important: the following is a transcription of the handwritten draft minutes for the meeting, and may contain errors or omissions. Where the draft minutes are difficult to read, this is indicated by '(?)'. The surnames of the people mentioned in the minutes are not given in this transcript (check Parish Clerk's copy for full details). If you wish to advise of any errors or omissions, make your observations at the next parish meeting, when the minutes will be read out.

Present / Apologies - see Parish Clerk's copy of the minutes for list of those (21 people) recorded as attending, and of the (1) apologies received.

The minutes of the Parish Meeting of 22nd November 2018 were read and agreed as a true record.

Matters Arising

Poldark Lodge, Barleysplat: this matter remains with the council enforcement team. We were advised that there is a gallery open to the public at Barleysplat. Mr John K agreed to look into this as there has been no planning permission for this.

There was general agreement to **change the format of the Parish Meeting AGM**, so that there are the chairman's and treasurer's reports and the election of officer, but then we should revert to a normal parish meeting as all other matters may not be raised again until the next AGM. Thus they will be raised at the next meeting.

Correspondence

1. **Trengoffe(?) Bridleway** – this remains on Cormac's list of schemes to do, but don't know when it will progress.
2. **Pre-application [PA19/01165/PREAPP](#)** for a *proposed Dwelling for applicant and family member to live in. Animal Shelter for Fowl/Horses, Land North Of Higher Mount Farm:* as this was a pre-application, the parish meeting was not consulted prior to the council's decision, but we were sent the reply from the council after its opinion was formulated. It concluded that an application would not be supported by a planning officer.
3. PCSO Stephen Edsen had carried out **speed checks in Mount** on three occasions. On each occasion, one vehicle exceeded the 30 mph speed limit, these being 32 mph, 32 mph and 34 mph. It was thought that his high visibility clothing would have alerted drivers; however this is part of his safety measures. Parking on the crossroads was raised, and whilst this may provide a natural calming measure it impedes visibility. Mr John K agreed to place notes under windscreens again.
4. **Review of polling stations** has again been carried out but there will be no change to Warleggan Parish voting in the Jubilee Hall.
5. **Traffic calming measures in Mount:** Mr M Eddy has assisted Mr John K in completing a form requesting rumble strips and signage to promote traffic calming measures.

County Councillor Report (from Mr Eddy)

Mr Eddy explained that if you are an **unpaid carer**, you are entitled to have an assessment carried out, and there is a small capital scheme available. He will highlight this in the parish

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newsletter. **Fletchersbridge road repairs** are finally underway. **Noel's Meadow** [extension] planning application is going through the system. Development on **land adjoining Colliford Tavern** remains in the hands of lawyers. Cornwall Council is purchasing housing for the homeless with an aim of securing housing for 1000 households but with no right to buy.

Other Business

1. **Planning application [PA19/03559](#)** Construction of first floor extension to east elevation at 1 Trelawn Cottages Mount: The planning subcommittee unanimously supported the application but felt some modification would enhance the development which the owners appeared to readily accept. Our reply was: *Warleggan Parish Meeting supports the application although during the discussion it was considered that windows to the front and rear elevations would have been preferable to the roof-lights to provide a more symmetrical elevation layout.*
2. **Warleggan Carnival Committee** had traditionally key posts[?] voted on at the Parish Meeting AGM. The last carnival was in 2006 and whilst it was initially hoped that it may be restarted at a later date, this is now seen as improbably due to falling interest, insurance costs and requirements etc. At a meeting of the carnival committee on 8/11/2006 attended by [six named people] the future of the carnival was put on hold and the residue funds, cups, trophies etc. were to be kept until those present at that meeting agreed what to do with them. Mr John K has collected the cups; some are peeling and not in a good condition. Three to four cups possibly silver are in a respectable condition and could be re-used [?] for other parish events such as the Big Do in the Field, or the village Flower and Produce Show, if the text panel was changed. Unsuitable cups should be offered back to the families who donated them originally. With the support of [carnival committee members present at this meeting] Mr Geoff S, Mr Henry J, Ms Veronica C and Ms Julie G **it was agreed to use these cups** to the best of their ability for parish events. The residue funds amounting to about £724 were held with HSBC bank; however increased administrative requirements described by Mr Andrew M, the Treasurer, to the carnival committee had resulted in the HSBC holding both the carnival accounts (current and deposit hosted[?] under the Warleggan Sports Committee) in a centrally administered account, but could be reclaimed when this was requested by the parish. It was **agreed in principle to bring these funds back into the control of the parish** by paying it into the Parish Meeting account; however this should be done on the understanding that this should be used for something specific and to the benefit of the parish. We would use the Parish Magazine to seek ideas for the use of the money; the closing date for suggestions would be the end of October 2019. With the support of the meeting Mr Andrew M agreed to follow the instructions given to him by the HSBC to reclaim the funds and the pay it into the Parish Meeting account as described.
3. **Light on Mount Crossroads** managed by the reading room. The clerk had received a petition of 28 persons supporting this light. It was agreed at the meeting to purchase a new light with a time switch. Mr Bob H to organise this and we would finance it up to £60.

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4. **Traffic using Newlands Hill from Pantersbridge to Warleggan** was raised again; Mr John K has written to St Neot parish council seeking permission for a sign as it would be sited in their parish.
5. **Dog faeces** remains a problem; notices will be put up.
6. **Warleggan noticeboard**: Mr Keith H is making a replacement.
