UNSUNG HEROES AWARD

ST BARTHOLOMEWS'S CHURCH

Progress is being made towards the start of the construction of the Toilets and Store to be built in the New Churchyard at Warleggan alongside the Church Field. These will be available not only for those attending church services but also for the Big Do and Concerts in the Field and occasional visitors. During the summer months many local families have found the Field to be a great place for picnics with plenty of room to spread out for social distancing with friends. Such use of the Field is welcomed. We would stress that the Toilets will be for the use of the parish as a whole and not just Church attendees.

One of the conditions of the planning permission for the building was that an archaeological watching brief has to take place when any excavations are undertaken (at a cost of £1,630!). The initial archaeological work is to take place on 14th September. Assuming that reveals nothing untoward it is hoped that actual construction work will begin around the end of September.

The total cost of the project is likely to be in the order of £22,000 even allowing for the voluntary labour that has been offered. To date we have raised £15,500 from donations and grants from the Garfield Weston Foundation and the Allchurches Trust. Further donations would of course be most welcome to John Keast who is managing the project.

When you see any activity on the site do look in to check on progress.

.....*Notes from the Vicarage*

ANDREW BALFOUR, Rector of St Bartholomew's Warleggan 1999—2014

Dear Friends,

I think it is fitting to mark the life, ministry and death of Andrew who was priest and friend to many in this parish. I choose to do this using the words I shared at his funeral. I have added in the references for you to look up in italics. These words mark the fact that Andrew, through both his living amongst us, and his funeral, continued the Christian's endeavour to be a good and faithful servant, proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ.

We gather this day, on this Holy ground, to give thanks for the life of Andrew Crispin Roxborough Balfour, husband, father, grandfather, brother, relative, friend and priest; to honour him and to farewell him.

Andrew's life touched many and in a few moments we will listen to something of his story.

Our time together this afternoon is directed by Andrew, by him being clear about what we should do **for** him, and **alongside** him this day.

He left a very clear message in the choices he made for his funeral. Indeed we will hear Andrew's message to each of us in hymns, readings and prayers.

Andrew, this day, tells us about life after death in our first hymn. (*The Day of Resurrection*) He reminds us to be careful about the way we live our lives and to seek forgiveness for that about which we have been careless - in the words of the Hail Mary.

He has chosen to encourage us to shape our lives in hope and charity; and to take time to be still; and notice the Holy One walks with us. (*Readings from Corinthians chapter 13 and The Gospel of Luke chapter 34*)

Andrew reminds us of his own personal faith, which did give his spirit voice as he told of the greatness of the Lord. (*The hymn, Tell Out My Soul*)

And as we will walk with Andrew through the village he will remind us of the centrality of joy and peace in music and song, to words from the prophet Isaiah (*Chapter 55*).

Our future is in our hands

In so many ways our future is in our hands. We need to wash them to keep from spreading the virus and in order for the local Test and Trace to work we need to respond to calls from the NHS. New figures showed that around 40 percent of people in Cornwall identified as having had contact with a positive case of Covid-19 are currently not engaging with the NHS test and trace team, potentially putting lives at risk.

If you've ventured to the coast then you will realise that Cornwall is full. Those in the holiday trade tell me this is the busiest they have ever seen it and this will go some way to making up for lost earnings and I hope it will sustain them through the winter. Contrast that with Julie and my venture to Port Isaac in late June when we walked down through the village at 6 in the evening and met 11 people, 1 dog and two cars!

The Director of Public Health for Cornwall has just released her Annual report for Cornwall where she takes a wider view of health issues within the context of a warming planet. Without making changes to our life style a baby born today will face a world that is, on average, 4°C warmer by their 71st birthday. This puts their health under threat for a range of reasons, including extreme weather (heat and intense rainfall), new infectious diseases (ticks and malaria), pollution and psychological stress. Covid gave us a brief view of what the world could be like with less vehicle movements. Currently many Cornwall Council staff are working from home and this has reduced the council's commuting mileage by nearly 1 million miles a month. Keep safe now and for the future.

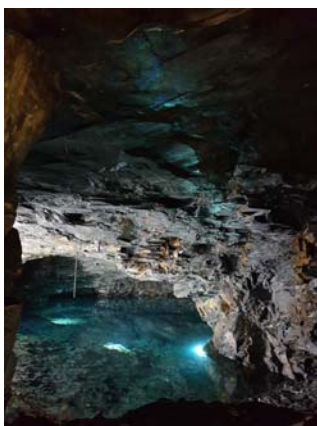
