## **BIG DO & PRODUCE & CRAFT SHOW IS BACK!**

Yes, after a lapse of two years due to COVID, we are back in action. Let's make this one to remember. As many volunteers as possible will be needed to set up and take down marquees, etc. Setting up the Friday evening before and packing away on the Saturday evening following the afternoon's event.

So start thinking about your entries for the Produce Show there would be no show without YOUR support.

Vegetable classes are much the same except that with the earlier date we have dropped tomatoes and onions and replaced them with lettuce and radish. We have classes for potatoes, carrots, cucumbers, peas, beans, courgettes and herbs. You just have to produce the listed number of items as similar as possible. Size doesn't matter, it is how well matched they are.

With the fruit classes we have put in a class for strawberries to reflect the earlier date.

There are plenty of classes for flowers and anyone who has a garden or even hedgerows near them will find something they can enter.

For the cooking classes the men need to practice their Quiche Lorraine and the ladies a Chocolate Fudge Cake. There is a class for savoury bread rolls, a cake made with vegetables, but not the ever-popular carrot cake, and the usual preserves classes which are open to everyone.

Now everyone can take photographs these days and with previous group winners not entering this year, the classes are wide open. Think about summer, furry creatures and anything pink. There is also a free choice class for your favourite photo.

The usual art & craft classes allow everyone to demonstrate their skills, whatever your hobby there will be a class you can enter.

We hope that the children's classes will have a good range of entries. The pre-school children have to decorate a pebble and the 5-11 years have to arrange some flowers in a jug.

## OUT & ABOUT THE COUNTRYSIDE

**05.05.22 At last**, with the slightly warmer temperatures the garden is starting to take-off, that means the weeds are growing well. Yes, despite trying to let the garden be 'wilder' we still have weeds, mainly grass where we do not want it. Every year we religiously weed our raised veg gardens and the fruit beds. We are very good in that all of our waste goes into the compost bins to make compost which then goes back onto the veg and fruit beds. However after many, many years we still have not mastered the art of good compost as it never seems to heat up enough to kill all the weed seeds. Therefore our compost simply redistributes the seeds and each year we have a new batch to contend with. Current 'top of the pops' and spreading well is what I call 'goose grass', also known as cleavers or wiregrass. With its capacity to stick to anything, even the dogs, it is bound to outwit us, and with its ability to climb up and overwhelm other plants it is a good job it is not much larger or it would qualify as a triffid.

**13.05.22 Isn't this** a beautiful time of the year? The weather has improved at last and those cold easterly winds can fade into the memory. Although we have just had a good day of rain I know gardeners and farmers will complain about lack of rain, but it is wonderful to have dry ground beneath ones feet. I have just visited Warleggan church yard which certainly celebrates 'No Mow May' and hopefully June and July as well. The wild flowers are glorious and the species are steadily increasing, there are bluebells and stitchwort, viper's bugloss has arrived as well as speedwell and cuckoo plant to name just a few. With the warmer days the insects are starting to appear and I saw Speckled Wood and Green Veined White butterflies, and white-tailed and tree bumblebees on my brief visit. It is so appropriate that a churchyard celebrates everything that has been created.

**20.05.22 Last week** I had the pleasure of visiting a large, historic [in the Domesday Book], privately owned estate. It comprised 750 acres which the wealthy owner has gradually allowed to re-wild over the last ten years. The land stretched from moorland down to the steep sides of the Camel Valley. We were there to find evidence of dormice so we followed deer tracks through hazels copses down to the river. We sat beside the Camel to have our lunch in a beautiful spot, that probably no person had seen for months. A kingfisher flew over our heads as he went up stream and then downstream. A woodpecker objected to our presence and a roe deer was rather startled to see us. It is so good to know that Cornwall does have these small, hidden pockets of wildlife and that some of the super rich are willing to spend their millions on preserving the environment, rather than on yet another luxury yacht or house. And no, we didn't find any dormice, but that gives us an excuse to go back - doesn't it?
