

Below is a precis of a meeting at St Neot regarding the shop closure

UPDATE FROM OUR SHOP MEETING

The meeting considered that basic groceries including dairy, bakery goods, local produce such as meats, fish, veg boxes, basic cooking ingredients, healthy ready meals, chocolates and sweets, pet food, cleaning materials, toiletries, newspapers, alcohol and tobacco were essential, along with the ability to pay by card. The 'nice to have' things included incorporating the post office into the shop and providing a parcel collection and returns service. Other ideas on the wish list included a delivery service for the less able, a consulting room for a doctor or therapists, a prescription service, a café, drop in space, library of used books, and a photocopier, printer and Wi-Fi. Much of this will depend on where and how a shop is run, but they are definitely good ideas for the future.

A keen discussion was had about where a shop might be hosted. Many thought that Cott Yard would be a good location, but there were also other excellent ideas put forward.— extending the Pavilion, redeveloping the toilet and bus stop area in the car park, a static unit on the car park or near the Pavilion, or a mobile shop in the short term whilst a permanent site is agreed.

There were a number of ideas about who might operate the shop— would an existing shop provider or franchise want to come in to the village, or would a business already here like to take this new venture on. Also, it was suggested that we develop a Community Shop staffed by a manager and volunteers.

The meeting agreed that a steering group should be appointed. Nominations to set up a group were put forward and Joe Rowe (farmer), Martin Eddy, Sandra Rowe, Garry and myself have been asked to seek out people who have the time, commitment and skill sets to lead on a feasibility study and draw together the most appropriate format for our shop and get it up and running in what is a tight time frame. The skills we are looking for include governance and legal structures, accounting and finance, business planning, fundraising and bid writing, operations and health and safety etc, HR and 'employee' relations, and marketing, PR and social media.

So this is a call to arms, can you contribute to the Steering Group either as a member or an advisor. Furthermore, if you'd like to get involved and dip in and out, there is likely to be small subgroups to focus on these areas when additional resource is needed, so let us know your interests. Finally, going forward there will be further meetings and perhaps a survey, to ensure we can all get involved if we want to. RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS – FROM PANTOMIME TO PETS, PASSING THROUGH LENT AND EASTER

As the glamour and colours of the pantomime fade, Lent began on **Ash Wednesday**. In total contrast to the make-believe world of the panto, Lent seeks to bring us back to the rawness of human life. It continues through March until the end of Holy Week in April, and echoes the 40 days of self-reflection, which by tradition, Jesus spent in the wilderness before he began his ministry.

Originally Lent developed as a period of nurture and learning for new converts and who then became full members of the Church when they were baptized and Confirmed on Easter Day. Over the years, it has become a time of reflection and redirection for Christians. A time for a sort spiritual "spring clean".

In Lent, Ian Wheatley will be running a discussion group, entitled "**What do you believe?**" . It will take place on Wednesday nights in the social club, and will begin on 1st March at 7.30pm. The details are given below. These relaxed sessions will run throughout Lent. Feel free to come to all, some or part of each session.

As Lent draws to a close we move into Holy Week and Easter. Compline will be said in Warleggan Church on **WEDNESDAY 5TH APRIL**, Liz will lead a service in Mount Village hall on **GOOD FRIDAY** and again this year we will host the spectacular Easter Vigil on **SATURDAY 8TH APRIL** at Warleggan Church with the light of the fire, the Vigil, renewal of baptismal vows and the first Eucharist of Easter.

On **APRIL 30** we will repeat our very lovely Blessing of Animals and Teddies in Warleggan Church. This is where Warleggan meets the Vicar of Dibley, but of course we do the service better! Please come along and give thanks for the pets and animals that share our lives and some our homes!

We have restarted **Open the Book** in St Neot School, which you may know, are bible story sessions for the children in the Primary School. We hope to run these a few times each term from 10-10.30am on a couple of Friday's each half term. If you would enjoy being part of this group and like telling stories to children, please let me know. Grandparents often tell a good story!

A really important date for your diary is **SATURDAY 18TH MARCH**, in the village hall in St Neot from 10 am -1pm, when we will be launching our MAP, a **Mission Action Plan**. A sort of 5 or 10 year plan. This will be a process which firstly involves taking an audit of the things we already do and do well, and then daring to dream what might be possible.

The relationship between the churches and our villages is very strong. But we do need to look to the future. But we need to work hard to secure what we have and be assured of its place in the lives of those who follow us. I hope that as many of you as can, and you don't have to be involved in the regular life of the church, will come along and participate. The day will start at 10 am and finish at 1pm. Please come tell us about how you think we can grow our church as a place of worship and a resource for our community life and activity.
