Beware. He is unearthed, and he is coming. **Keep** your windows locked and garlanded with garlic!

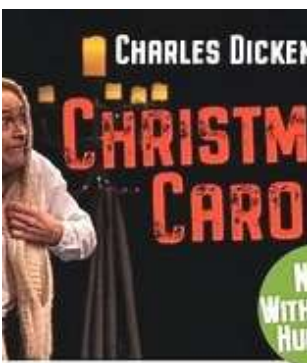

Rector's Ramblings October and November 2024

Have you ever wondered how the church is funded and what is costs to run our church? The answer to the last question is easy. It costs around £356 a week to pay for Warleggan Church.

In terms of where the money comes from hopefully what follows will answer that question.

It is often assumed that the Church of England has loads of money, and parishes like ours have access to bottomless pits of money. And indeed, whilst the CofE is asset rich most of this goes into paying staff, (clergy and lay people), housing for working and retired clergy, training and pensions, and some for mission or outreach. Occasionally there are small grants, usually about £1000, for building projects and often these days they are associated with making church buildings more energy efficient and environmentally friendly.

The Church of England's income is derived from property, glebe land, stock market investments, and money given by individual church congregations through the collections plate, donations and bequests. In the Truro Diocese, this is called the Mission Maintenance Fund (MMF).

Each parish has three financial responsibilities:

- to support the Diocese and national Church
- to maintain the upkeep and repairs of church buildings and open cemeteries,
- and to fund mission locally.

At Warleggan Church this year, we have to find £18,500 or £356 weekly to pay our bills. We pay

£6594	to the Diocese
£2100	for insurance, heating and lighting
£4650	for expenses for resources and working expenses.
£5100	additional money, which varies each year, for upkeep, improvements and repairs to the church building and our open cemetery.

We get nothing from the Diocese or central church for the repair, upkeep or maintenance of the church or cemetery. The restoration of the building, the new roof and the toilets was derived from congregation giving and collections, bequests, donations and part grant funding.

At St Neot this figure is about £41,500 annually or £800 a week. And together that means as a Benefice, we can just about pay our way. We break even, without little extra to support projects that might grow or expand our pastoral work and mission within the community. Our MMF contribution allows that together with St Neot Church, we raise enough for a House for Duty priest, (this means the Rector is given a house and expenses but is unsalaried, and have to support themselves financially).

Within the Diocese there has been a massive reorganisation of parishes and those that are not 'sustainable' will merge with others, and a few will close, as the cost of their upkeep outstrips the ability of the parish to meet these costs. As ever, finance and the falling numbers of those being ordained, dictates the shape and scope of our ministry.

We are fortunate in our church because we just about pay our way, and we have people amongst us committed to the future of the church they love. If our contribution to the Diocese was not paid in full, the Diocese could suggest an amalgamation with an adjacent parish which would mean the end of our "House for Duty Status"

We are mindful of the responsibilities we bear for the care and good stewardship of the church and our mission within the parish, for preserving our heritage, sustaining traditions and creating new ones. Thank you to everyone who makes that possible. Our church is indeed a gem on the moor. **Garry Swinton**

“FOR KING & COUNTRY”

On Sunday November 10th at 2.30 p.m. we will stand alongside the War Memorial at Mount cross-roads to remember those from the Parish who gave the ultimate sacrifice for the future of this country.

Cecil Chapman lived with his parents at Crossways opposite the War Memorial and was only 18 years old when he died in captivity in what is now Iraq on 8th May 1916. Cecil is buried in the Amara War Cemetery north of Basrah.

Thomas Henry Knight and his parents were living at Mount Post Office just behind this Memorial. Tommy Knight was 29 when he was killed on 26th October 1917 at Polygon Wood, near Gheluvelt, Belgium. His body was not recovered and he is commemorated on a panel of the Tyne Cot Cemetery in Flanders.

Thomas Henry May's family lived at Sina on the road out past the Chapel. He was a submariner on His Majesty's Submarine E37. On 1st December 1916 she was lost in the North Sea off Harwich, probably mined, and the crew of 30 perished. Tom's naval records state "Body not recovered for burial" and goes on to say "Killed or died as a direct result of enemy action". Tom May was 24 when he died and is also commemorated on the impressive Naval Memorial on Plymouth Hoe.
