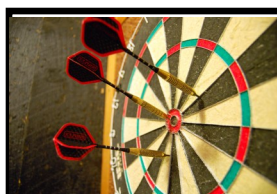

Countywide 20mph Speed Limits – Phase 3 Liskeard & Looe

Cornwall Council intends to implement a 20mph Speed Limit on most residential streets within Liskeard, Looe, Bodinnick, Crow's Nest, Dobwalls, Duloe, East Taphouse, Higher Tremarcombe & Darite, Lanreath, Lower Clicker, Menheniot, Merrymeet, Millendreath, Mount, Pelynt, Pengover Green, Polperro, Polruan, Quethiock, Seaton & Donderry, St Cleer, St Keyne, St Neot, Tremar & Tremar Coombe, Trewidland, and Widegates (in most locations the existing speed limit is currently 30mph). These settlements, which are part of the Liskeard and Looe Community Network Area, have previously expressed strong local support for this. Buffer zones will also be implemented leading up to these, where deemed necessary. Please see additional documentation for further details of proposed extents.

It is considered that implementing a reduced speed limit (20mph) on roads within these areas will make a major contribution towards improving road safety, especially for vulnerable road users, and traffic using these roads. This, in turn, will aid in the achievement of the Council's 'Vision Zero' goal – working towards the prevention of all fatal and serious injuries on the county road network.

The imposition of 20mph speed limits in these locations should also improve the amenity of these areas and assist in encouraging a transition towards individuals using active travel, particularly for local journeys, resulting in increased journey time reliability and healthier communities. Severance by traffic will also be reduced, facilitating a greater use of local community facilities and enabling more liveable streets. As well as encouraging more social interaction, this may also be beneficial to the local economy.

The wider roll-out of 20mph speed limits is also likely to reduce noise and air pollution, via the reduced need for motor vehicles to use harsh breaking and/or acceleration, providing additional positive health benefits for both visitors and residents alike.

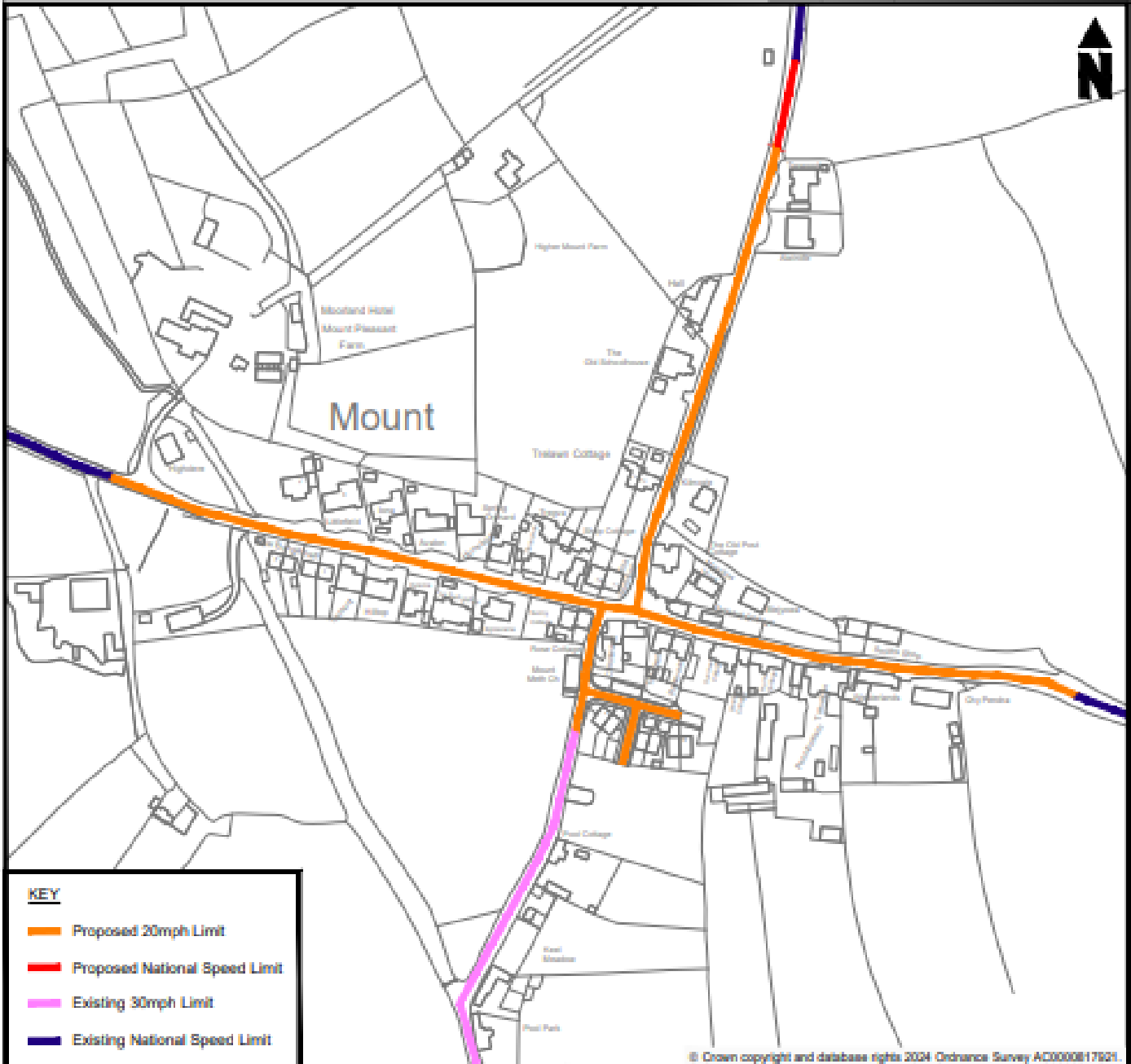

Rector's Ramblings Advent and New Year 2024-25

Advent is the first season in the new church year and starts four Sundays before Christmas and occupies most of the month of December.

Its main themes are that of **Hope** and **Light**, which speak to us in the darkness of a Moorland winter. It reminds us of a God who breaks through the toughest places and toughest moments of our lives and is somewhere in the background carrying and embracing us in gentleness. Advent leads into Christmas Day, when the Christian Church, celebrates the moment when God breaks into our physical world as a vulnerable child. It's all there; vulnerability, light, darkness and hope.

In the old Book of Common Prayer Confession for Morning and Evening Prayer there is a line in which we confess **'those things which we ought to have done'** and that is the crisis the church has found itself in which culminated as I write with the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury. Few would deny that we are not far more conscious of Safeguarding procedure and regulation in the Church than we were a decade or two ago, but the present crisis arose because things have not always been followed through as they should have been, and the mantra of safeguarding is "Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility." This has left survivors of abuse even more vulnerable than before. And our thoughts and prayers are with them. That for them there will be some light in darkness, and hope for the future.

Within our church all office holders are required to undertake some degree of Safeguard training dependent on their role, and some has been trained a long side volunteers from the social club and institute. We like to think of our community and our village as a safe place, but we must never be complacent. It is as much about relationships between men and women, as adults and children or any relationship between people which are toxic, abusive or bullying.

But Advent is about Hope and looking forward, and this magazine will take us with in a stone's throw of spring at the end of January. The symbolism of light conquering darkness is depicted in the story of Christmas, and demonstrated visually in our Christmas carols, readings and services. We hope you will join us for one of our services over the Christmas period.

A village Christmas is a very special occasion.

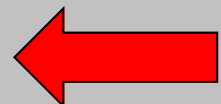
